**How could the Shire of Kent improve its access to buildings, facilities, and information / improve disability access and inclusion?**

| Shire office door is quite heavy, and difficult to open for some.  |
| More footpaths around Nyabing and Pingrup, with ramps.   |
| Have automated doors to the buildings, as they are quite heavy to open.  |
| More lighting around the public buildings.   |
| An updated information board and more information on social media.   |
| Keeping the community up to date with what is happening around the shire more frequently.                          |
| Gravel and sand paths and culverts are not wheelchair, mobility acceptable areas.                                  |
| Stairs into all buildings are not suitable.  |
| Areas for disabled family and community members to socialise and learn about the community                         |
| Hand rails at the main street toilets due to the incline.  |
| A board (like in Wagin) on the main street that has information, upcoming events.                                  |
| Paths to be kept clear of debris, stones, sand, etc.   |
| RSL Hall - possibly pave the back area as the ramp at the back can't be reached in a wheelchair due to blue metal. |
| Signage.   |
| Level door thresholds, pathway access directly in front of door with ramps.  |
| More ramps and railing. Have swinging doors (push-in)  |
| The Nyabing Pavilion has heavy entry doors and short step landings at the rear kitchen doors.                      |
| The Shire of Kent Administration Office entry is very heavy and difficult to manoeuvre                             |
| Provide easy and clear entry into all public buildings   |
