

Shire of Kent Disability Access and Inclusions Survey Open Ended Responses

How could the Shire of Kent improve its access to buildings, facilities, and information / improve disability access and inclusion?

Shire office door is quite heavy, and difficult to open for some.
More footpaths around Nyabing and Pingrup, with ramps.
Have automated doors to the buildings, as they are quite heavy to open.
More lighting around the public buildings.
An updated information board and more information on social media.
Keeping the community up to date with what is happening around the shire more
frequently.
Gravel and sand paths and culverts are not wheelchair, mobility acceptable areas.
Stairs into all buildings are not suitable.
Areas for disabled family and community members to socialse and learn about the
community
Hand rails at the main street toilets due to the incline.
A board (like in Wagin) on the main street that has information, upcoming events.
Paths to be kept clear of debris, stones, sand, etc.
RSL Hall - possibly pave the back area as the ramp at the back can't be reached in a
wheelchair due to blue metal.
Signage.
Level door thresholds, pathway access directly in front of door with ramps.
More ramps and railing. Have swinging doors (push-in)
The Nyabing Pavilion has heavy entry doors and short step landings at the rear kitchen
doors.
The Shire of Kent Administration Office entry is very heavy and difficult to manoeuvre
Provide easy and clear entry into all public buildings
